



Tom Brown says, "Wow, what can we say? The crowd was great (lined up to the street waiting to get in on Saturday morning).

From the standpoint of results, the numbers are better than we expected. Last year's sales made \$2900. That was by far the best sale in recent memory but to some extent, could be credited to a good amount of COVID inventory that was added to that year's merchandise. Based on that, we expected a little over \$2,000 this year. In fact, preliminary numbers show a profit of approximately \$2600, not counting a successful day of sales at the What-Not Barn and Bike Shop.

Pretty amazing. Huge credit goes to our volunteers who worked for hours sorting through boxes and miraculously setting up attractive displays for the shoppers. Our tree department worked painstakingly setting up numerous trees, fluffing wreaths and checking lights. And, of course, the shoppers who turned out to make their many purchases. Hot coffee, donuts and cookies were offered by Judy Ferrari throughout the day.

A big thank you is deserved by the What-Not Barn volunteers who collected and packed these treasures all year long and moved them into the Clubhouse on Friday morning, and to Betmar Security who assisted throughout the sale. It was heartwarming to see everyone chatting and smiling with Christmas music playing in the background. You make us proud to live here. Thank you all!!"
