Our original thoughts were that we would have 15 to 20 residents who would go shopping – BBB provided food/personal care products to over 90 residents. We ran out of food. We have learned so much over the past year. The

biggest is that our residents are so generous and helpful. We even have people who no longer live here contribute. We could not have served our residents without the volunteers. We have learned a lot about our community and the needs. We now carry a wide variety of aftercare equipment (they are posted on our Face Book page), wide variety of personal care products, laundry and dish soap, dry bleach just to name a few. We also have a list of organizations and churches who help. We have gone from being open on the Distribution Day to being open daily.
