With a Betmar Website that has over 120 pages, sending the webmaster a statement and saying, "Please post this", would be very similar to sending a \$100 dollar bill to your bank with a sticky note that simply says, "Put this on the account".

The Webmaster commonly gets this type of request, so I believe it's time to explain the lay of the land along with, some terms, and communication ground rule requirements.

- First off..." Post", NEVER means send an email. "Send an email", means send an email.


Chorus
