

Wow! The holidays are over and it's time to settle in to all those activities we have to offer here in Betmar.




One of the fun ones is Beginners Art. We meet, talk, teach and paint. If you haven't tried please think of us and come to see what we are all about.

From the President Happy New Year!!!! - it's a new calendar year and it's golf membership renewal time. Whether you sign up as a Full member or as a Limited Social member we welcome you to Betmar Golf Club.

As you might be aware by now the Golf Club board voted to now have the members pay the sales tax on our membership dues. Although our dues are among the lowest you will find anywhere, we as a club were losing membership dues monies in sales tax. For a 700-member club we were only getting 650 paying member dues as the other 50 members were paying the sales tax for the club.

In order to provide a better golf course for our members' enjoyment we needed a remedy to this issue. So now there is a sales tax line on the application. Last year we identified that there were numerous people that just liked occasional golf or for possible health reasons just couldn't justify a full membership. So, the golf board implemented the Limited Social Membership (LSM) -the LSM allows a limited member to join and pay the equivalent of a guest fee and play daily golf after 11:00AM.

This allows the Full members to get in their typical morning round with a little less congestion and yet let the LSM play after 11:00 and in the afternoon or evening special events specifically. So, we hope to see everyone at a golfing special event. If you have questions on joining the Golf Club, please contact Laurie Black Membership director for details and which membership might fit you best.

As you may have seen quite a bit of work has been done to the course lately and we want to thank all the volunteers that have stepped up to donate their time in the improvements along with the Betmar Acres Properties team.
