President's Letter

Elections for the Betmar Board will be March 3, 2022 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Annex. Absentee Ballots are available in the Betmar Office now if you want to pick one up. Please know that we have checked with three lawyers who all say that according to all our regulations and of course, Robert's Rules of Order, write in candidates <u>are</u> allowed for every office. So, choose carefully who you want to represent you next year.

There is also a separate vote on whether our homeowners want to pay \$79.00 each year to cover ever increasing insurance fees and to establish a special fund for Betmar to self-insure for damages to our Common Property.

In addition, there are the HOPA forms that every household must fill out each year to keep us up to date. We need a current record of everyone living in every house. Each and every resident/renter needs to stop by the office with a photo ID and fill out the HOPA form, please. It only takes a few minutes. All the forms are kept locked in the vault in the Betmar Office. If you do not fill out a form, you count against our required 80% being 55+.

Our winter season is drawing to a close and before long our Snowbirds will be packing up and heading North for the summer.

FOR OUR SNOWBIRDS: Besides your general activities of closing up for the summer,

- Have you checked with the Office to see they have your emergency information up to date?
- Have you given someone a key to check your house especially after a summer storm?
- Have you filled out a Dark House form so the Sheriff's Department will check your house while you are away? The forms are available in the Betmar Office.

• Have you cleared your yard so there is nothing to fly around and damage property if we do have one of those BIG storms?

FOR OUR SUNBIRDS:

• Have you updated all your Emergency Information in the Office? I have it on good authority that the Hurricane Committee will be posting information next month in all the clubhouses.

- Have you filled out a form for the Special Needs Shelter this year? The forms are in the Betmar Office.
- Are you ready for all the celebrations that Activities has planned for us here in Betmar over the summer?

Now Walt and I are off to enjoy the various shows being put on by the clubs and the last dinners and fish fries. We are also looking forward to the holiday celebrations, ice cream socials and special events being planned for the summer. NEW TABLE & CHAIR PROCEDURES

Pre-COVID, the responsibility for setting up tables and chairs for large events was assigned by blocks of streets. The schedule of the setups was hand delivered to the affected homes each month.

Since COVID, a small group of dedicated individuals has been performing these duties. With the pandemic waning, the Betmar Board has decided it is time to reinstitute past procedure in order to spread the work out across the park as we did before.

Beginning with this Bulletin, the assignments for setups will be posted for the present month and the following month. Since Bulletins are no longer hand delivered, the setup schedule will continue to be posted in each week's Coffee News.

FAQs:

- 1. How do I know which block I am in? The Betmar map with blocks shown is provided as the centerfold of the Betmar Resident Directory (aka, the phone book).
- 2. What are normal times for setups? The times will be specified in each week's Coffee News article. Most times are scheduled for 8 o'clock. This team does not work on "Betmar Time". The work begins at the specified time (not a minute sooner). You do not need to come early and you should not worry that half the work will be done when you get there. This was past practice and continues to work well now. Many setups are completed in 30 minutes or less.
- 3. Is this year-round? Though some setups are required during the summer, block assignments apply from October thru April.
- 4. What is involved? Moving tables and chairs. Setups are limited to Clubhouse 2 and the Annex. Volunteers are shown how to move tables in a manner that is safe and does not require heavy lifting. There is work for anyone who shows up. We currently have men and women, young and old helping out.
- 5. How will we know what to do? There will always be someone there to guide you. In addition, the more complex layouts are now printed out and are available on the wall in Clubhouse 2.
- 6. How much of a commitment is this? Assignments are for only two weeks. You are encouraged to support your neighbors during your block's turn, But can always feel free to beg off for any reason. We are like Planet Fitness – A No Judgment Zone.

Of course, it goes without saying that anyone can come and help at any time. There is no penalty for helping the folks from another block. Following are the current assignments.







What-Not Sale Non-Profit Initiative

Each year, toward the end of the What-Not Sale, a small number of Non-Profit groups have been allowed to shop for free. This typically involves a very small number of church or veteran groups, usually recommended by a Betmar resident. While this is a nice thing to do, it invariably leads to confusion depending on how well the details such as what time they can come, who they should see, etc... have been worked out. It is not always timed right to coincide with our departments packing up everything that is left for the Salvation Army. For next year's sale we will test a new, more coordinated give-away, one that will benefit more local organizations and the amount of packing we do. This initiative has been discussed with our Department Heads, Golf, Acres and Owners Boards and is approved as a one-year trial. Starting now, we will accept suggestions from our residents of local non-profit groups that might like to participate in this give-away that will take place between noon and 1 o'clock on the last of the January 2023 sale. All we need for now is the name of the group, a very brief description of their mission and a contact point.

We will leave this request for nominations open to you until this fall, at which point we will decide whether to announce it to the public or not. This decision will be based on the number of groups nominated from within the park.

Later in the year we will contact the groups and explain the process. At that point they can decide if they are interested. The details will be worked out depending on the number and size of the groups expected to participate. We will control who can come and the time at which they can shop based on how many show interest and the extent to which our merchandise matches their needs.

As of now, there are only two rules:

1. They must be local.

2. They are not a retail business.

Presently, we give away all that is left at the end of the sale to the Salvation Army Central Warehouse for distribution across 2 or 3 counties. With this new approach, more of it could go to small local groups who might appreciate it even more.



Bicycling Safely

Bicycling is a good way to get exercise and become familiar with all areas of the park and it seems that more folks are taking advantage of our beautiful streets and pathways. That being said, I'd like to remind riders of a few basic rules of bicycle etiquette that will make riding safer for everyone. First be sure that your bicycle is in good working order, making sure that your headlights and taillights are bright and angled so they are visible. Be sure that you have a bell or horn that gives a loud enough signal to be heard by someone that might be ahead of you on the trail. Second, know and use appropriate hand signals when stopping or turning. There are several good sights on the internet where you can brush up on the rules. Third, in our park bicyclists have first and second priority on our trails, but with privilege comes responsibility. It is a bicyclists responsibility to announce their presence when approaching a pedestrian from behind. This can be done with a bell or horn and should be accompanied with a verbal warning of what you plan to do, i.e. "passing on your left." This warning informs the pedestrian of your presence and where they should move to get out of your way. Remember that we are an older population that is often hard of hearing and that we move slower than we once did. Give adequate warning so the pedestrian can safely get out of your way. By following these simple rules of bicycle etiquette everyone can enjoy traversing the beautiful trails through our park


