

My name is Bob Engler, and I am running for Property Director. I want to introduce myself and highlight why I am the most qualified candidate this year.

After attending Michigan State University, I returned to our family farm in Isabella County. During my years on the farm, I also worked as a licensed home builder in my spare time. After the farm was sold, I went to work for Morbark Industries, a local manufacturing company. I started as an assembler/mechanic. Within two months, I was sent all over North America to troubleshoot and service their Chipharvester Whole Tree Chippers. While at Morbark, I worked my way up to managing three different departments. Wanting more, I left and started my own company, Woodsman Inc. Over the next 25 years, we outgrew 5 facilities and grew to 50 employees, with annual sales of 25 million. The time came that I sold out to the Terex Corporation. After selling, I wanted to slow down, so I worked selling and servicing farm equipment until retirement last May.

My professional experience has prepared me well for this position.

- 1. The five manufacturing plants I built while owning Woodsman required me to work with building contractors, plumbers, and electricians, including negotiating contracts and obtaining the required permits from different governmental agencies.**
- 2. Effective employee management is essential. My experience running my own company, Woodsman Inc., taught me valuable lessons in leadership and management. Since the Properties department employs the most people in the park, careful and experienced management is critical.**
- 3. Besides managing the building, taking care of the golf course and the common grounds is very important. I have 25 years of experience in the arborist industry, with a strong understanding of ground maintenance and tree care, which aligns well with the responsibilities of this role.**
- 4. Buying and maintaining the equipment is also an essential aspect of the property's job. My years of knowledge will be invaluable in this capacity.**

While I did not retire until last May, I have actively contributed to our community by helping cook Betmar dinners, serving on the Bylaw Rewrite Committee, and, currently, as president of the Swim Club.

Diana and I have owned a home here for over ten years. We love the park and its people, and I am committed to continuing my service to our community.

James Wencel, Candidate for Properties Director

My wife Rita and I live on Kay Avenue and are Florida residents. I have a great deal of experience managing property, buildings and employees as I was a school administrator before my retirement. As superintendent of Bad Axe Schools, I managed many projects including a multimillion dollar building and renovation project. I oversaw the entire project working with a construction management firm along with an architectural firm. I wrote bid specifications for some of the projects and worked with the architect and construction manager for the remainder.

I am currently on the Betmar Board of Trustees as Acres treasurer. I was also the chair of the Bylaws Review Committee for two years. I am a member of the golf, swim, pickleball, game club and recently joined shuffleboard. I am a member of Betmar's competitive horseshoe team.

I am the chair of the Tennis/Pickleball Club maintenance committee. In 2024 I proposed a \$120,000 project to completely remove the existing asphalt and base on the old tennis court area. The project involved replacing the base, asphalt along with acrylic surfacing, striping and fence work. The Tennis/Pickleball Club paid \$50,000 and \$70,000 came from the Capital Expenditure Fund. I managed the project working with the asphalt contractor, fence company and court surfacing company. I reported to the Properties Director and the trustees as well as the Tennis/Pickleball club during the project providing updates along the way. This past fall I coordinated the resurfacing of two of the four caged pickleball courts with plans to resurface the remaining two courts this spring.

In the fall of 2024, I volunteered to work on getting Clubhouse 2 safe for our residents to use after it was flooded because of the hurricanes. After the water subsided, a team of volunteers used the water extraction machine to remove the rest of the muddy, and most likely contaminated, water. I first tested the inside of the building for mold. I rented a machine from Home Depot that mists/fogs a product called Concrobium Mold Control into the air which eliminates and prevents mold plus mildew. I also used a sprayer to wet all the carpet along with the nooks and crannies with the product. Besides Clubhouse 2 main room, I used the product in the bathrooms, annex, kitchen, communications office, outside HVAC units and the What Not Barn. I was assisted by Tom Brown and Scott Wachsmuth in a few of the areas. A few days later, I retested for mold and found all areas clear except the Communication Office, where the carpet couldn't be fully cleaned. I recommended replacing the carpet, which volunteers completed.

Growing up I worked with my grandfather at his gas station and later helped with his vegetable farm. I also worked at area farms, bailing hay, harvesting crops, fixing the farm equipment and helped manage a feed lot. I have worked as a marine mechanic, as a marine patrol sheriff's deputy, as a test driver/mechanic for Chrysler Proving Grounds, a chef/line cook for a high-end restaurant and worked for a construction/concrete company. My diverse experience will help Betmar Properties operate efficiently. I will work closely with our Property Manager to continue the progress that has been made recently to our buildings and grounds
