

Communications

NEWS FROM THE WEBMASTER

A couple Website changes have taken place recently, and I just wanted to let you know about them.

1) The Comments section (button at the top of this page.... https://betmar.org/comments/) is no longer password protected. This is a test. When we decided to put the password in place, we went from about 50 comments per week, to less than 2 per month... ...It simply stopped being used. As you may recall, this password was put in place when comments got out of hand, and Betmar Administration simply felt it prudent to not air Betmar's dirty laundry on a public forum. Please keep comments professional, and we'll see how it goes. IF unsuccessful, the page will likely come down completely.

2) The Betmar Calendar page on this website (https://betmar.org/calendar-2/) has for some time had a "Printable Calendar" option button at the top. When using this link, please understand that the "Printable Calendar" is a snapshot in time, taken at the beginning of the month.. ...view this like the old paper copy you used to put on your refrigerator. No one came to your refrigerator with changes and cancellations, and they still won't. But the live calendar shown on the calendar page WILL. So, if you want to double check the time or status of a meeting or event, please double check the live calendar. The Printable calendar now has a disclaimer at the top to remind you of this. Most things remain the same, so the refrigerator calendar is still a good idea. Just be sure to double check if necessary.

OTHER STUFF:

When Betmar community emails are sent out, DO NOT REPLY TO THEM. Your reply will go to the central repository that launched the community email. ...so, it goes nowhere. If the Community email says "Contact Bob Smith" then send an email to Bob Smith. If the community email has something you would like to comment on, then email your comment to the appropriate person, or use the Betmar Comments section link on the Coffee News. I try to clean out the central repository often, and forward what I find to whomever "I think" it should have been sent to. But the bottom line is, "Reply" or even "Reply to all" goes nowhere. I see a lot of emails that say things such as, "Put me down, I'll helps", or "Why did that happen?" I believe some people think they are sending their comment out to all of Betmar.sorry.... you're not. The Central repository (which we pay Google for) allows us to send bulk emails in quantities that exceed Gmail or other provider limits. It's common for us to send out 10,000 emails in one day. If you are on the receiving end of one of these forwarded emails, please respond to that person.... don't hit replay, which puts your response back into the repository. Ever use the Betmar Website? If your answer is no, THAT'S IMPOSSIBLE. ... You're on it now. Hit the "Home" button at the top of this page to bring you to the main menu. I find it funny how many people read the Coffee News every week, but say they never use the Website......The Coffee News is located ONLY on the Betmar Website. The email you get simply provides you with a link to this section of the WWW.BETMART.ORG website. This e-mail was sent from the BETMAR Website (https://betmar.org)



Betmar is proud of its 8 pickleball courts and its tennis court. The club is an option for all Betmar residents.





Pasco Sheriff Letter Holiday Shopping Safety

As we are entering one of the busiest shopping times of the year, it's important to take steps to keep safe while shopping. Being aware of your surroundings while shopping in person and considering your safety online can prevent you from becoming a victim this holiday season. These shopping safety tips from Pasco Sheriff's Office can help keep you and your purchases safe this season.

When heading out to shop in person, staying vigilant of what's going on around you can keep you and your items safe. Consider where you park by choosing a well-lit and highly visible spot.

Remove your personal belongings when exiting your car and store any large packages out of sight in the trunk. Always lock your car doors, close windows, and set an alarm, if possible. Be attentive when walking or driving in parking lots for everyone's safety.

Shop with a buddy; thieves are less likely to target people in groups. When shopping with children, designate a place for them to meet you, such as customer service counter, in the event you get separated, and make sure children know to ask a security guard or store employee for help.

Although gift cards offer flexibility, they also create ideal opportunities for scammers. Buy gift cards directly from the retailer and save the receipt. Carefully inspect gift cards and their packaging prior to purchase for signs of tampering. If a gift card appears damaged, notify a store representative, and ask for a new card. Never buy gift cards from an auction or community website. Resale sites are often an outlet for stolen, fraudulent or already used gift cards. Although online shopping is convenient, always think before you click too quickly to protect your personal information.

Only use secure Wi-Fi networks for online purchases, as public Wi-Fi is usually unencrypted and therefore, much less secure for your personal information. • Verify you're shopping on a secure and legitimate website; secure websites start with https://. Beware of phishing attacks. Don't click on pop-ups or open suspicious advertising emails.

Using secure accounts with creative passwords can protect your account from hackers. Using credit cards for online purchases can offer enhanced fraud protection compared to other forms of payment; avoid using debit cards for online purchases.

Crimes of opportunity, such as package theft, often increase during this busy shopping season. If you know you will be away for a delivery, have packages delivered to a safe location such as an office, a package room or to a trusted neighbor who is home during the day. If it's available from a retailer, choose free in-store delivery, order pick-up lockers or curbside pick-up for extra security that works with your schedule.

If a package is stolen, notify the retailer and delivery company, and file a report with law enforcement.
