

#### HOW BETMAR RESIDENTS STAY INFORMED

Many tools have been created to keep Betmar owners and tenants informed. All residents are urged to take advantage of these tools.

#### Betmar website (https://betmar.orq)

Our website contains links to important sources of information you will often use.

We suggest you create a bookmark/shortcut on your device's home page to take you there. The Betmar website will allow you to:

Register to receive important e-mail notifications regarding every aspect of life in Betmar. You should do this as soon as you possibly can.

Access the on-line phone directory, the Betmar Calendar and several other documents mentioned below.

Open the section "What-Is-It/How Do I" where questions new residents may have are answered. Examples are explanations of how Betmar is managed, whether we have Pickleball or a pool, what's the What-Not Barn and many more. Explore over twenty-four Betmar "clubs" and find links to each club's webpage.

#### **Monthly Betmar Bulletin**

The Betmar Bulletin contains information about the operation of the park, along with information submitted by individual clubs regarding upcoming events. It is distributed electronically to everyone who receives Betmar e-mails and also is available in hard-copy format on request.

#### **Coffee Hour and Coffee News**

Coffee Hour is hosted by the Betmar Activities Team. It is held every Tuesday morning at 9 a.m. in Clubhouse 2. Attendees are informed of scheduled events and provided general information regarding their friends and neighbors while they enjoy a cup of coffee and your favorite donut or toast. A hard copy of the information presented is sent out to every e-mail recipient every Tuesday night in the weekly "Coffee News."

#### On-line Phone Directory

The official hard copy phone book is updated annually. The On-Line Directory is maintained continuously. New owners are encouraged to send in their listing as soon as they have a telephone number. The On-Line program can list any amount of phone numbers, e-mail addresses and a photo.

#### **Table and Chair Procedures**

The responsibility for Table & Chair setups is assigned by Block from October to April. The assignments are shown below. The schedule for the setups is posted every week in Coffee News. Please refer to the centerfold of the phone book for a map showing the block locations.

As most know, if you are holding an event in Clubhouse 2 or the Annex, assistance for setting up your tables & chairs (and resetting the space after you are done) can be provided. The only exceptions are picnics since each picnic group handles this on their own.

In addition to a regular table and chair crew, help is provided by individuals who volunteer when their block in the park is scheduled. The assignments for block volunteers are published in the Betmar Bulletin and in the weekly Coffee News.

#### FAOs:

How do I know which block I am in? The Betmar map with blocks shown is provided as the centerfold of the Betmar Resident Directory (aka, the phone book).

What are normal times for setups? The times will be specified in each week's Coffee

News. Most times are scheduled for 8 AM. This team does not work on "Betmar Time". The work begins at the specified time (not a minute sooner). You do not need to come early, and you should not worry that half the work will be done when you get there. Many setups are completed in 30 minutes or less.

Is this year-round? Block assignments apply from October thru April.

What is involved? Moving tables and chairs. Volunteers are shown how to move tables in a manner that is safe and does not require heavy lifting. There is work for anyone who shows up.

How will we know what to do? There will always be someone there to guide you.

How much of a commitment is this? Assignments are for only a two-week period. You are encouraged to support your neighbors during your block's turn.

HOW DOES THE TEAM KNOW I HAVE AN EVENT? Contact us ahead of time so we can plan your setup. Alternatively, the team scours the Betmar Calendar to see what is planned for these two spaces. THIS IS ONE MORE REASON WHY IT IS

IMPORTANT YOU HAVE YOUR EVENT LISTED IN THE CALENDAR. AFTER YOU HAVE RESERVED THE SPACE WITH ACTIVITIES, YOU MUST REQUEST IT BE INCLUDED IN

THE CALENDAR BY CONTACTING THE COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE OR BY SUBMITTING A CALENDAR REQUEST ON THE BETMAR WEBPAGE.

#### **Dance**



We are signing residents up for the Thanksgiving Basket. All you have to do is contact Sue or Cheri. We will need your name, address, and phone number. You can even leave this info in an envelope placed in the bin.


#### **Caregivers**

#### **Pasco Sheriff Letter**

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Domestic violence is one of the most common, and often most dangerous, calls for service the Pasco Sheriff's Office is called to investigate.

Domestic Violence Awareness Month is observed in October as a way to show survivors they are not alone, while also bringing light to resources available to survivors. PSO reassures survivors of domestic violence that both help and resources are available. No one, not even those you love or live with, has the right to harm you physically or mentally. Knowing your rights and options is the first step to ending abuse.

Family and friends can play a vital role helping survivors of domestic violence. If you suspect a loved one may be suffering from domestic abuse, start an open conversation to address it.

Survivors want to be heard, so listen without judgment and validate their feelings and experience. Ask how you can best support their decision, especially if you are concerned for their safety. Working with local resources, victims can create a personal safety plan before taking action to leave an abusive situation. If a situation ever becomes an emergency, call 9-1-1 immediately.

PSO's Victim Advocates offer a wide array of services for survivors and ensure that a victim's rights are upheld throughout the investigative and judicial processes. PSO's Victim Advocates may also function as a liaison on a survivor's behalf, if they wish. Victim Advocates help survivors evaluate and navigate available resources, such as legal action, arranging immediate shelter for a safe place to stay, medical appointments or legal meetings.

Other resources include Sunrise of Pasco County, Inc., a local domestic and sexual violence center that provides free services like counseling, advocacy, and support services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence. Those experiencing domestic abuse often lack a safe place to stay to break the cycle of abuse, and staying with family or a friend may not be the safest option if the abuser knows where to find the victim.

Sunrise provides confidential housing temporarily for those in these situations. All services provided by Sunrise are free of charge and confidential. The National Domestic Violence Hotline, which can be reached at 800-799-7233, is a free and confidential resource, providing services by phone and online chat with access to over two hundred languages.
